THE OPPORTUNITY

The School of Information Sciences (iSchool) at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign invites nominations and applications for the position of Executive Associate Dean. The anticipated start date is negotiable and ideally by summer 2024. Reporting to the Dean of the iSchool, the Executive Associate Dean will provide leadership for the internal administration of the iSchool, including administrative oversight for the work of the iSchool's associate deans and assigned staff, as well as coordination of iSchool faculty affairs.

The Executive Associate Dean should possess a Ph.D. or other terminal degree in one of the many fields within the Information Sciences and a record of recognized achievement in research, teaching, and service that would warrant a tenured appointment at the rank of Professor in the iSchool.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

About the School of Information Sciences

The School of Information Sciences at Illinois is an international leader in interdisciplinary research and education, home to world-class faculty, top-tier research, and academic programs that are consistently ranked highly by *U.S. News & World Report*. Its mission is to lead the way in understanding the use of information in science, culture, society, commerce, and the diverse activities of our daily lives—and in doing so, change the world.

The iSchool's academic programs include the top-ranked Master of Science in Library and Information Science and the Master of Science in Information Management. The school has two fairly new and growing undergraduate programs: the Bachelor of Science in Information Sciences and the Bachelor of Science in Information Sciences + Data Science. In addition, the School offers a Doctor of Philosophy in Information Sciences, the oldest program of its kind in the nation, and an MS in Bioinformatics, Certificate of Advanced Study and K-12 Library Information Specialist Licensure.

As a longstanding innovator in online education, the iSchool offers many programs for students who study from a distance. The total enrollment consists of more than 900 graduate students and over 500 undergraduate students who learn with enthusiasm and contribute to the dynamic intellectual life of the School.

The successful candidate will be an accomplished and recognized leader in Information Sciences or related field who can build upon the iSchool's strengths. Key responsibilities include:

- Oversee the work of the iSchool's associate deans and supervise staff
- Coordinate faculty searches, onboarding, and mentoring of new faculty, including tenure-system, specialized, and adjunct faculty
- Coordinate annual reviews, third year reviews, and the promotion and tenure process
- Serve as a resource for all faculty in developing strategies for increasing effectiveness and resolving problems
- Represent the iSchool in collaboration and consultation with college department heads
- Lead analysis of faculty staffing needs and develop faculty staffing proposals
- Coordinate mentoring and support for faculty, including mid-career faculty
- Work closely with the iSchool dean to leverage resources and expenses to realize strategic goals and growth objectives
- Serve on iSchool and campus-wide committees related to areas of responsibility

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE / QUALIFICATIONS

The successful candidate will have the highest commitment to academic and scholarly standards and be an accomplished leader in their field. Successful candidates will also bring the following professional experience and traits:

- Significant higher education administrative experience (minimum of at least three years) at the department (Chair/Head or Vice/Associate Chair/Head) or School/College level (Associate/Assistant Dean) or equivalent leadership portfolio, ideally in an interdisciplinary environment
- The ability, in conjunction with the faculty and other administrative leaders, to articulate and execute a collaborative vision for the iSchool by providing influential leadership and transformative impact through education, research, and outreach
- At least 5 years of experience in a position that foregrounds a commitment to interdisciplinary research and teaching
- Experience in supporting and cultivating a distinguished, accomplished, inclusive, and diverse faculty, that span disciplinary boundaries and that includes a variety of faculty positions (tenure, non-tenure track and adjunct) including experience with tenure cases and faculty development
- A commitment to attracting and supporting strong students and a dedication to creating an open and inclusive environment at all levels, undergraduate, graduate, certificate, and non-degree students. Ideally with experience in accreditation processes
- A passion for facilitating the success of others, whether faculty, staff, students, or others
- The intellectual leadership and curiosity to provide guidance in order to enhance a robust research and innovative educational programs
- Outstanding communication skills with strong interpersonal skills
- Demonstrated significant leadership ability working with different stakeholders and constituencies in a university setting, ideally in an R1 institution or equivalent
- The ability to think with agility across a broad spectrum of ideas and disciplines
- Experience and the desire to build and/or identify new synergies among iSchool faculty across the range of information sciences including library, information, computer, and data science that span subfields within humanities, social sciences, sciences, engineering and other fields
- An appreciation for what research can bring to teaching, education, and society, and the expertise to communicate that impact to a wide range of audiences
- Impeccable personal and professional integrity
